Program/Project objective	Provide young people from refugee backgrounds with opportunities to participate, connect and engage with participatory media and digital storytelling projects produced by STARTTS' Youth Team, with the aims of: a) Developing compelling, youth-led digital content which promote STARTTS, STARTTS' clients and the triumph and resilience of the refugee experience b) Starting conversations around community mental health for people from refugee and non-refugee backgrounds in local and national contexts
Role Purpose:	To help create the brand, layout and website development of STARTTS' Digital Project and assist with ongoing content management and UI/UX modifications.

- Received COVID-19 vaccination by the deadlines of the NSW Public Health Order (more information below)

**As a not-for-profit Affiliated Health Organisation, STARTTS is required by law to adhere to the Public Health (COVID 19 Vaccination of Health Care Workers) Order 2021, which commenced on 26 August 2021. The Order establishes mandatory requirements for health staff and persons working in health settings to be vaccinated with a COVID-19 vaccine. The Order requires the first dose of a vaccine by 30 September 2021, with a second dose required by 30 November 2021.*
